Community First summary


Community First is an £80m government-funded initiative that will run for four years, until March 2015. The programme will help communities come together to identify their strengths and local priorities in order to plan for their future and become more resilient. It will fund both new and existing community groups.

Via the Neighbourhood Matched Fund, £30million is now available to fund community projects in some of the most deprived areas of the country of which, Whalley Range is one. People will be encouraged to give time, expertise and resources towards the projects they identify in their areas. The government will match these pound for pound, helping to stimulate local action towards meeting community needs. The Community First Neighbourhood Matched Fund is an initiative that provides local communities with the means to address their own priorities:

- Communities set up local panels in each eligible ward, and decide upon projects for funding in their area.
- It is a matched fund programme, which means that every £1 provided in funding must be matched by a similar amount of in-kind donations (this means donations of cash, services, free products or volunteer time).
- Funding has been allocated at ward level across every local authority in England. Eligible wards
 were selected on the basis of high levels of deprivation and significant increases in benefits
 claimants. The amount of funding for each area is based on the concentration of these
 characteristics within a ward.
- Because funding is targeted, only certain electoral wards are eligible in each Local Authority



The Whalley Range Community First Panel has funded many local projects to date; all of which were identified and delivered by local people, in our community.

Community consultation

- Initial Community First meeting: details of the Community First initiative sent out to Whalley Range Community Forum mailing list members to identify potential Panel volunteers.
- The Whalley Range Community First Panel consulted with members of the Whalley Range community to find out what was important to them and what the priorities were at several events including:
- U Decide participatory budgeting event, (Noticeboard with CF information leaflet handed out to individuals including Urdu translation during the initial stages of the project)
- Celebrate Community Festival: noticeboard, leaflets distributed
- Chorlton Library community event
- JNR8 Keep Fit Class, WRYOA Whiz Project young people and staff feedback received re local priorities
- Project also promoted with details of 'how to apply' with translated leaflet sent out to relevant groups and support to fill out application form
- Community First leaflet designed: local resident approached to translate leaflet to most used W/Range community language (Urdu) to ensure details of project reached non English speaking residents and to raise awareness of the project within so called 'hard to reach' residents and groups
- Funding round one advertised in bulletins and in News & Events newsletter and leaflet sent out to local groups i.e. school PTA groups, residents associations
- Deadline for round one re-circulated via bulletins/newsletter
- Round 2 advertised via above channels
- Visits to groups to promote project and assist with application forms

Residents attended events to discuss and complete the questionnaires and to formulate priorities.

- News & events circulated ward wide
- U Decide Residents handed out flyers at U Decide
- Celebrate festival
- Whalley Range Methodist Church neighbours event

The Whalley Range Community First Panel met on 21st March 2013 to agree the final plan and which has been agreed as a living document.

Local volunteers audit
